By his twentieth birthday, Andy had played Carnegie Hall and won the legendary Union Grove Grand Championship on guitar at the Union Grove, NC Fiddler's Convention. He has appeared with artists as diverse as Pete Seeger, Merle Haggard, Nickel Creek, Brownie McGee & Sonny Terry, and John **Hartford** in a career spanning five decades and three regions of the nation.

As an educator, Andy's relaxed, common-sense approach to teaching is rooted in his background in developmental learning, his interest in creative problem-solving, and his career as a musician. Building on his degree in Fine Arts and Art Education, he has taught thousands of people to play guitar and mandolin, has been an Artist-in-**Residence** in schools throughout the Northeast, and has has led **seminars** for youth and adults across the

nation on such topics as creativity, performance skills, music history, and balancing life and the music business. He is a yearly performer and educator at major festivals like MerleFest and Winfield and a regular workshop contributor to the Country Music Hall of Fame.

Andy also started and runs the **IBMA award-winning** label, Swift River Music.

Andy May's Acoustic Kis s Showcases are festival-based non-competitive performance opportunities for young musicians, beginner through pro. A festival setting ensures an interested, supportive audience. In turn, the audience is treated to an Opry-style stream of entertainers, each performer doing 1-3 numbers. Andy facilitates the on-stage dialogue in the role of emcee, mentor, and educator, putting the young performers at ease with his laid-back style and genuine interest in their accomplishments.

Hundreds of young musicians have participated in Acoustic Kiss over the years, some of them going on to become professional musicians and/or champion instrumentalists, including Chris Thile, Sara Watkins and Sean Watkins of Nickel Creek.

Andy May's Acoustic Ki s has become a much-loved tradition at major music festivals, such as MerleFest and the Walnut Valley Festival, over the past 25 years.
